



In the Park...**Candleridge Park News**

1. The American Flag was replaced in May.
2. The latest update from the city on the footbridge erosion project is that its plan/goal is to start on the construction this summer (July timeframe) and finish by this fall (October timeframe). This is subject to change, of course, and is not 100% finalized or approved. The city still has to estimate some costs and work through some other details.
3. The flagpole stone wall is in need of some repair/rework due to stability issues (loose and missing stones). We are seeking options and getting estimates on getting this done. Keep in mind that the stone wall surrounding the flagpole is not meant to be sat upon, so please use the provided park benches instead.
4. Cowtown Cleanup took place April 1st and volunteers from the neighborhood and McKinney Bible Church gathered to pick up trash around the lake and greenbelt areas. We collected 21 bags of trash. Thanks to all who participated in this event.
5. The city maintenance contractors are back in full swing mowing, weeding, and trimming. The PACS team still remains busy with other regular maintenance around the park such as collecting trash and fallen limbs and removing debris from the lake which is especially a problem after heavy rain. Hope many residents made it out to the park to enjoy the beauty of the primrose wildflowers this spring.
6. Coyotes continue to roam the neighborhood, so be sure to play it safe by keeping your pets on a leash and in fenced areas at all times.
7. Continue to comply with Animal Control laws by keeping your pets in an escape-free fenced yard and on a leash at all other times.
8. The summer months always bring more park visitors and plenty of heat. Keep safety a priority by complying with posted speed limit signs around the park and neighborhood (30 mph). Also remember to maintain slow speeds in our alleyways (20 mph) as this is becoming increasingly problematic. Be aware of duck crossing signs and slow down or stop for our feathery friends as they cross the road to area residences to seek shady resting and nesting spots. Always expect the unexpected when driving in the park area. Children and ducks are at play, so keep in mind that one could dart in the street from between parked cars at anytime. Drive like you live here...oh wait, you do.

History Highlights French Lake in Candleridge

How many neighborhoods have an oasis? Here in Candleridge we enjoy the greenbelt's biking and walking trails which lead to French Lake in Candleridge Park. French Lake opened to the public in June 1981. The American flag proudly flies every day, welcoming us into this oasis. At the flagpole base is a flowerbed of blooming, drought-tolerant, perennial plants. The city park around the lake is mowed by the City of Fort Worth, but volunteers maintain the flowerbeds. While walking or biking on the wide walkway around the lake, we see the park benches, picnic tables, playground equipment, ducks, geese, turtles, and fish in the lake. The lake's aerating fountain in the water is a cooling feature and helps maintain water quality.

In the beginning, the lake was created from a little creek on treeless prairie pasture land. With the city planting the trees and citizens watering them the first year, we now enjoy the large shade trees. French Lake is fed by a small intermittent creek that starts just west of Hulen Street. There are also several large drainage culverts that empty into the lake. Water flows northeast out of French Lake where it is joined by another small creek soon after it crosses Wind Chime Drive. The creek continues northeast, passing through Edgecliff Village and finally joining Sycamore Creek just east of Edgecliff Village. Sycamore Creek flows north through Carter Park, Cobb Park, and Sycamore Park to reach the West Fork Trinity River near I-30 and Riverside Drive.

The partnership with the City of Fort Worth and the Candleridge Homeowners Association (CHA) makes this leafy, green, outdoor space so enjoyable. Thank you to the neighbors who walk your dogs and pick up after them; and thank you to neighbors who pick up any trash left behind by unthinking visitors to the park. This is our neighborhood lake park, and we like it green and clean. Thank you to Dana Wells, our elected Park Coordinator, for overseeing our oasis. She, like all the CHA Board members, are volunteers in our great community.

Voter Apathy?

There are 55,393 registered voters in City of Fort Worth District 6 (our district) and only 4,635 voters participated in the May 2017 the election.

Only 33,036 votes were cast in the entire City of Fort Worth in the May Mayors election!!!!

Although you may be aware of these statistics, a reminder may be a good thing because voter and citizen apathy is the main ingredient in the recipe for change which may or may not be for the best. As you can tell by looking around our city and state, North Texas, in particular, is growing rapidly. Rapid population and community growth invites development both desirable and undesirable.

In addition to many other responsibilities, CandleRidge Homeowners Association monitors development around us because part of what gives value to any home and community is the nature and character of the surrounding property. There is an expectation of stability and continuity that is built into the value of a home and community. In fact, that's part of the reason why many people have chosen CandleRidge as a place to live and raise their children.

The issues of zoning, residential restrictions, and commercial development are inherently a local issue; however, in the absence of vigilant monitoring, regulations and restrictions are ignored or bypassed through legislation.

Vigilant monitoring is just one part of what is necessary to prevent the undesirable changes in regulations, restrictions, or property use. Citizen apathy provides an unchallenged easy path for regulation, restriction, and zoning changes—some good and some not so good. Citizen awareness and willingness to participate in the decisions regarding proposed changes is essential in maintaining the quality of our community and property values.






