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## *In the Park...*



### **Candleridge Park News**

New park signage referencing park hours and important city ordinances are now located on Misty Meadow, Francisco, and King Richards. Watch the signs and our website because the hours may be changing soon as the city moves to standardize hours to maintain consistency with all city parks.

The footbridge erosion project did not start in July as planned, and we are waiting to learn about the revised timeline for this to be done. Some temporary erosion repair around the monument and benches just below the footbridge is underway.

The flagpole stone wall is still in need of some repair/rework of loose and missing stones impacting its stability. We have contacted the city for a second time to see if it will provide the needed repairs so that we do not have to pay for the repairs.

This year's change to a 21-day schedule for mowing, weeding, and trimming parks combined with the unusual late-summer precipitation has contributed to higher growth of grass and weeds. PACS continues to remove debris from the lake brought in from heavy rains, collecting trash, and picking up fallen limbs. We have requested to have some additional low limb tree trimming done. See the CHA website for the complete mowing schedule.

The trash cans are currently being evaluated by the city for replacement throughout the park and greenbelt areas, and a few have been replaced already.

Because we have experienced some super hot days, the lake remains an inviting place for cooling off. Please remember that the lake is not a swimming pool for people or pets.

Coyotes will become more active when cooler temperatures arrive, so take precautions to protect your pets.

Back to school time usually means we will have fewer park visitors until cooler temperatures prevail. Please drive safely and comply with posted speed limit signs around the park and neighborhood.

Thank you to our faithful contributors who keep our park beautiful by consistently picking up trash or who are keeping watchful eyes and reporting unusual or suspicious activity. ## Animal Issues

Again, we are experiencing some unlawful squirrel and duck hunting (poaching) in the park. Please call 911 to report any individuals shooting at animals from inside a vehicle or retrieving the animals. According to Fort Worth Game Warden, these acts violate several laws: discharging of a firearm within the city limits, shooting from a vehicle, shooting across a property line, shooting across a road way, shooting without a proper license or approval, and wasting of a game animal.

Non-compliance of Animal Control laws has been severe over the summer months. We have had an over abundance of stray dogs has been present, and many park visitors are not keeping their dogs on leashes. Please keep your dogs on a leash AT ALL TIMES and repair your fences if needed to make sure that your yard is escape free. Put a lock on your gate for additional protection.

## Citizens On Patrol

Another wonderful summer is coming to a close, but it is still HOT in Candleridge. No matter what the weather is like, we all need to be vigilant in our surroundings and neighborhoods.

You see something suspicious going on? CALL POLICE NON-EMERGENCY: 817-392-4222

You see something that is an emergency? CALL THE EMERGENCY NUMBER: 911

<http://www.fortworthpd.com/crime-information/Default.aspx> For the 76133 area you will notice the different crimes in the various neighborhoods. For the CandleRidge area, you will see that we have lower crime. Thank you for your awareness and to our many Citizens on Patrol (COP) volunteers that patrol our neighborhood.

Current issues in the area are:

- Garage door open and nobody visible even in the alleyways leaving valuables exposed. Even the pastor of our church has been teased about his golf clubs missing since he left his door open. We sure gave him a hard time, but he closes the door now.
- Valuables remaining inside your car whether it is locked or not: Once the culprit thinks it is worth the risk and his time, he will ransack your car looking for anything of value. Take your valuables inside and lock your car door. It will save you money and frustration.
- The lawn companies have been warned to lock their equipment in their the trucks or attach them to their trailers since we have had a few thefts in this area. Do you leave your equipment out when taking a break? I did, and I lost an expensive gas edger that I only had a short time.
- Are your valuables marked? RAPIDS is a citizen's burglary deterrent program for use in homes, vehicles, and businesses. The program involves the marking of property with an identifying number as a means of discouraging burglary and theft. RAPIDS will label your valuables with your Texas Driver's License number or VIN number in a barcode format so that your property can be traced and identified as yours. This is a free service provided by the Fort Worth Police Department Crime Watch Section.

Want to join Citizens on Patrol? Please contact us. The training and certification is provided by the Fort Worth Police Department in a four hour class usually held on Saturday mornings. If you have ever thought about the security and safety of your neighborhood, then now would be a good time to step up and join this growing group of volunteers. Willie Redmon, Garden Coordinator of the First Christian Church of Arlington gave an informational presentation which included pointers for starting and maintaining a community garden. Mr. Redmon handed out a booklet of helpful information and told how his church started a garden some years ago called Harvesting Hope Community Garden. He shared what they learned and the enjoyment it has brought. He even told how to reduce vandalism by planting a "Vandals Garden" at the entrance of the garden and marking it with a sign reading "if you must take food, please take it from here." Think about it: 8 hours of sun, good soil and water for growing good food, as well as flowers and friendships. ## City News

Help keep our neighborhood as nice as it is! Let me again remind you that if you are planning on doing any kind of improvement on your property in CandleRidge such as putting in a storage shed or a deck or even enlarging your driveway, you have two issues that you will need to deal with prior to construction. First, you may need a city permit. Call the City at 817-392-2222 to have someone walk you through this process. My dealings with the City lately have been handled very cordially and efficiently. Secondly, you need to see if what you want to do is in compliance with the CandleRidge deed restrictions. Go to our homeowner's website, [www.candleridgehomeowners.com](http://www.candleridgehomeowners.com). In about the center of the page is a heading for "Deed Restrictions." Click on "CandleRidge Deed Restrictions Explained" for a summary of our neighborhood deed restrictions.

Street light out? Call the City at 817-392-8100. The people are usually very responsive!

Slowly but surely our neighborhood street resurfacing is coming along. Remember that this is the adding of a thin layer of new asphalt designed to make the existing road last longer, not a major reconstruction project. The contractor is supposed to come in and do some leveling work prior to the new asphalt being put down so that when the work is completed, the road should be a lot smoother. As of this writing, the City has put asphalt down on some low spots on my street which appear satisfactory to me. Be vigilant though. If you see rough spots not being done satisfactorily, please call Tariqul Islam with the Fort Worth street department at 817-392-2486.

*Do you have new neighbors?*






