Hi neighbors,

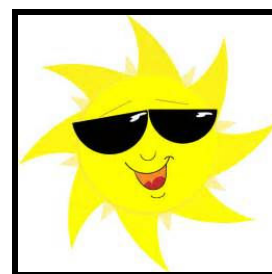

The City Bond Program passed, and there were several items which will benefit CandleRidge. There was \$256,000.00 allotted for repairs and improvements to French Lake Park which includes working on our pavilions, repairing the walking bridge, and fixing the erosion problems around the bridge supports and the erosion of the stream beds that feed into French Lake. The Bond Program also includes a new library to be built near McCart Ave. and Sycamore School Road.

Jungus Jordan, our District 6 City Council member, holds a "Java with Jungus" event every 3 to 4 months on Saturday mornings. Jungus goes over news and items of interest to not only the city but also specifically to our neighborhood. He shows pictures of new developments that are planned near us as well. Some of these include Tavolo Park located at Altamessa and Chisholm Trail and the new development surrounding and near the Walmart Neighborhood Market located at Sycamore School Road and Granbury Road. It's a great way to find out about the new developments that are going in and what businesses are coming to the neighborhood. I encourage each of you to attend the meetings. You can learn more about these meetings on the CandleRidge Homeowners Association website and Facebook page, and the CHA Email Blasts. Candleridge Park News

REMINDER: THE NEW PARK HOURS ARE 5 AM TO 9 PM - These new hours were set by the City, are to be year round, and are posted at all park entrances. This change has the support of the FWPD, and officers do regularly patrol the park after curfew to assure compliance and to help maintain safety and peace in our CHA neighborhood. Visiting the park area outside these hours could result in a citation being issued.

FINALLY, GREAT NEWS on the footbridge erosion project. Two landscape architects from the City of Fort Worth met to discuss options for repair of the area surrounding the bridge at French Lake and the adjacent picnic pavilion. Funding of approximately \$392,000 for this project will come from existing gas lease revenue, PayGo funding originally set to be used for the dam, and the approved 2018 Bond Program. This Bond Program will provide us with an additional \$256,000 so that there can be a needed permanent fix versus a temporary one, but will delay completion of the project until spring 2020. A tentative scope for the work agreed upon is in place and will be outlined as the project becomes more finalized.

Maintaining the beauty of our park and greenbelt is a big job. PACS (Parks and Community Services) and the City maintenance contractors are busy mowing, weeding, collecting trash and fallen limbs, and keeping debris removed from the lake after heavy rains. We appreciate PACS' hard work and efforts, especially during the hot summer months. Late bloomers this year were the primrose wildflowers. Lots of park visitors took advantage of their beauty by taking family photos.

Although coyote sightings have not been reported in some time, always play it safe by keeping your pets on a leash and in fenced areas at all times. Remember also to keep your pets safe by providing them with an escape free yard, keeping them on a leash while walking them, and carrying a bag to pick up after them.

Summer brings more park visitors and plenty of heat. Even though we have a drinking fountain, it is always a good idea to bring additional water with you. Safety remains a priority, so please comply with posted speed limit signs around the park and neighborhood, 30 mph. Residents, please SLOW DOWN in our alleyways which have a 20 mph limit as speeding is becoming increasingly more frequent and is dangerous. Although duck crossing signs are present, slow down or stop for our feathery friends as they cross the road to seek shady resting and nesting spots. You should always expect the unexpected when driving since children, ducks, and pets are also present, and one or more could dart in the street from between parked cars at anytime. It is NEVER pleasant when the unexpected happens, and it is our actions that help prevent this. BE CAREFUL and COURTIIOUS!

Candleridge Park is not only one of the nicest but also one of the most beautiful parks in Fort Worth. Many thanks to all who contribute regularly to help keep it that way. Thank You Citizens on Patrol Volunteers

Hello CandleRidge Homeowners, I hope everyone is doing well and enjoying the hot and soon to be hotter weather. My name is David Melton, and I am the new captain of the CandleRidge Citizens on Patrol group.

Information from Ruben Montelongo – Your Neighborhood Patrol Officer (NPO)

Whether the temperature is hot or cold and you see someone wearing a large coat that looks suspicious, don't hesitate to call 911. It could be nothing more than someone not realizing it was hot out before they left their home, or it could be someone concealing a weapon or stolen merchandise. I'm sorry to say that there will always be robberies in South Division, but please be vigilant. Carefully watch your surroundings, and keep purses, bags, and phones secure. If you're in the grocery store, be mindful at all times. Someone can easily walk by your cart and take something from you when you're distracted and looking somewhere else. Please continue to look after one another and don't hesitate to quickly call 911 if you see anything suspicious. Property Issues: Streets and Houses

Is your "new" street cracking? If it is, you need get it reported ASAP. As you know, the city is in the process of either repaving or microsealing most of the streets in Candleridge. Saldana and Cinnamon Hill were repaved, and so far they seem to be of first class work. Willow Way was one of the streets to be completely repaved; however, the workers ran into problems with it.

How does all this work? Prior to repaving, equipment is brought in to mill off most of the old asphalt, leaving a smooth but very thin layer of old asphalt in place. After milling Willow Way, it rained, and almost immediately the remaining asphalt failed in several spots and broke through the original base material. Since the failed spots were soft and very powdery, vehicles left deep ruts in the old base in several spots. Instead of repairing the failed base, the city went ahead and repaved everything. Almost immediately the new asphalt began giving way, leaving the street potholed and looking terrible in many places, the worst being on Willow Way just west of Welch.

I have been in contact with George Snowden, a superintendent with the street department, and he emailed me this response: "We have looked at Willow Way thoroughly and determined areas of repair. The block between Welch and Sparrow Point will need pulverization, stabilization, and repaving. There are a few more areas that will also need that process. We had core samples taken of Willow Way and recently received the results along with stabilization recommendations. We are currently finishing up a like project and hope to move to Willow Way next month. In the meantime, we will monitor and make some smaller repairs as needed."

I have also asked Mr. Snowden to look at a curb issue on Wind Chime just southeast of Sparrow Point that, in my opinion, should be fixed before Wind Chime is repaved. Thank you Mr. Snowden for your quick response!

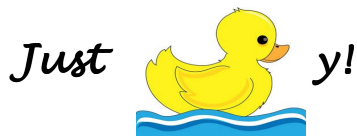
Welcome New Neighbors

Do you have new neighbors?

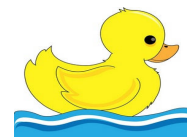

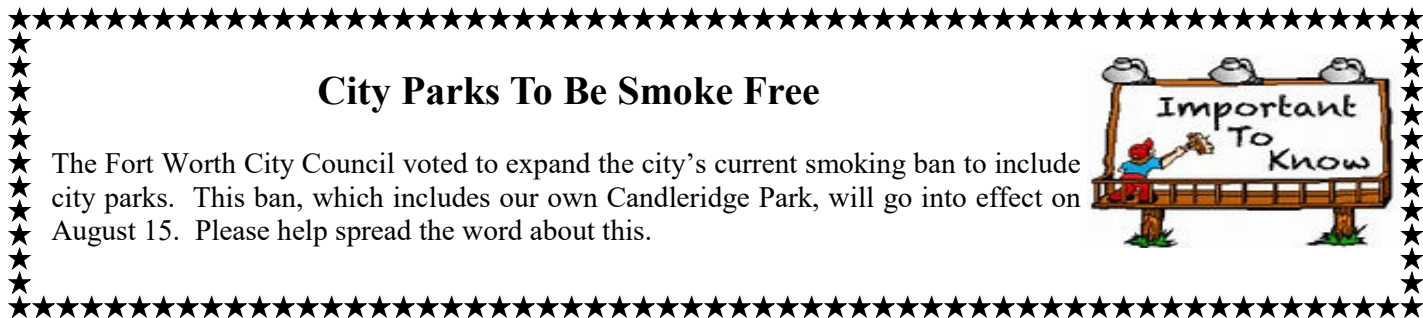
